#### **Announcement from Finance Committee:**



As we roll into the final third of the 2025 budget year, Finance Committee provides this update on the financial position of the church based on activity to the end of August.

Members will recall a budget with a deficit of

just less than \$38,000 was approved in February. In June we indicated that the vacancy in the Office Administrator position had reduced the projected deficit. Now, in September, our forecast deficit is about \$6,000. The biggest factor in our improved financial position is the rental income from the summer & fall daily occupancy of Lewis Hall by a local not-for-profit group. This has been a one-time infusion of funds for which we are very grateful. A \$2,000 grant from the Love2Thrift organization is also helping offset the costs of our outreach lunch bag program.

While this is fantastic news, we are cautious as the revenue side of the equation includes \$30,000 of donations at the end of the year and Christmas, based on historical donation levels. This amount is an educated guess, but could well vary.

The forecast deficit includes a projected shortfall in our givings to the Mission & Service fund. You will recall we confirmed our commitment to donate \$30,000 when the budget was approved. At this point in the year, the forecast M&S givings will be short by about \$2,000, which would be covered by operating funds.

We hope all of you will consider how your donation level can contribute to the life and work of our active congregation.


